A Blackfoot Elder, AÍAISTAHKOMMI (Shoots at Close Range) also known as Duane Mistaken Chief was born and raised on the Kainai Nation south of Calgary. A bronc rider on the rodeo circuit in his youth, he then worked as a police officer, a photographer and, for 18 years, as an instructor at Red Crow Community College. He also helped write the book, Blackfoot Ways of Knowing: The worldview of the Siksikaitsitapi, published in 2004 by the University of Calgary Press.

Duane Mistaken Chief is the Alberta Health Services traditional wellness coordinator and counsellor at the Sheldon M. Chumir Health Centre's Elbow River Healing Lodge in Calgary.
